This permit is issued under Section 134(1)(b) and Section 122 of the Biosecurity Act 1993, pursuant to *Bonamia ostreae* Controlled Area Notice BRC 2023-2. This movement is to be undertaken in accordance with the conditions specified within this permit. This permit remains in force for the time specified or until written notice of revocation is given.

Movement summary:	Consignments of live Green Lipped Mussels are permitted to be moved outside of the Upper South Contained Zone to the Lower South Protected Zone for all further Commercial Processing steps, including holding and preserving the shellfish live in tanks.

Conditions

General Conditions:

1. A copy of this permit must accompany the movement and be made available upon request to an Inspector or Authorised Person.
2. Immediately report any unusual or unseasonal mortality events to MPI's Exotic Pest and Disease Emergency Hotline (0800 80 99 66).
3. The permit holder must report to the MPI National Communications Centre (0800 476 224) any movement that happens which does not meet the requirements of this permit OR/AND any incident that may cause the spread of the unwanted organism, such as accidents and spillage.
The permit holder must advise that the on-call officer for the region is informed.
4. The permit holder must retain and provide evidence upon request that the permit conditions for this movement have been performed.
5. Permit holders are advised that permits may be changed, put-on-hold or revoked at the direction of a Biosecurity Inspector, or Authorised person.
6. The permit holder must provide a copy of these permit conditions to any employee or contractor undertaking activities allowed by this permit (including transporters) **and advise them accordingly that** any person undertaking actions allowed by this permit must comply with the conditions. Note that contractors, including transporters must be informed of this requirement in writing.

Live Shellfish for Retail Sale

7. Shellfish must be transported in contained, closed containers (bulk bags permitted) from origin to destination. These must be stored securely during transportation in a manner that prevents spillage.
In addition, all containers must be clearly labelled or have attached:
 - a. Details of the species contained and;
 - b. The permit which relates to the consignment. (Permit #).Note: "Contained" is defined as preventing any leakage, runoff water or loss of any product outside of the donor zone.
8. If shellfish are approved to be moved for the purpose of being contained and preserved live in tanks, the permit holder must ensure the receiving entity is advised in writing that water contained in these tanks must not be discharged in a manner which releases it directly into the marine environment (including through storm water drain disposal).
9. Prior to the disposal or discharge of this water used to contain the shellfish, the **receiving person / organisation** who held the shellfish must treat the water. Specifically:
 - Using a sodium hypochlorite (such as bleach or janola)
 - Apply at a rate of 1L of sodium hypochlorite per 9L of water contained within the tank (1:10 dilution)
 - Solution must be left in the water for a minimum period of 20 minutes before disposal
10. The **receiving person / organisation** must only further distribute live shellfish for the purpose of human consumption. No further live containment in tanks is permitted from on sale distribution at any subsequent licensed fish receiver, distributor, commercial entity, or wholesaler (excluding restaurants).



11. The permit holder must ensure that no shellfish runoff water, wastewater, or fluid discharged from the shellfish is discharged, leaked, or lost into a marine environment outside of **Upper South Contained Zone** (the donor zone) (including that contained inside packaging or containers). Should the water be discharged or released into the marine environment under any circumstances, the permit holder and / or its receiving entity must seek approval from a Biosecurity Inspector or Authorised person regarding the treatment of the water prior to disposal.
12. Consignments that are destined for a final receiving location for further commercial processing steps (including for live preservation in tanks) **within the Lower South Protected Zone at the New World store in Gore**, is exempt from having to undertake water treatment steps stipulated in condition 9 of this permit.
13. The permit holder, and the receiving entity must ensure that any shellfish (including shellfish waste) moved in accordance with this permit outside of the Upper South Contained Zone, must not be returned to the marine environment outside of this zone.
14. Any bags or containers used to harvest or transport shellfish moved under this permit must be disposed to landfill OR cleaned with a freshwater pressure wash (or saltwater only if fresh is not available) AND dried for a minimum of 48 hours, at the completion of this movement. These actions must be performed as soon as practicable after the movement and, in any case, before being used for further shellfish movements.
These actions must be undertaken in a manner which prevents pressure wash runoff from entering the marine environment.
15. If waste material that has been in contact with the shellfish (dead stock, biofouling and packaging) is not disposed of at the original harvesting site, it must be transported in contained, closed containers and disposed of on land at a point above the mean high-water mark as soon as practicable after any movement.
16. The permit holder is to provide a monthly report containing details of all movements in the previous month. The report must include:
 - CAN permit number;
 - Transfer date;
 - harvest locations (farm number & location);
 - transfer destination(s);
 - Date of arrival at destination
 - species; and
 - quantity.

The report must be provided to BonamiaControl@mpi.govt.nz by the 15th day of the following month.

The permit holder must retain a record of all stock harvested and transported for processing for a period of no less than 1 year. This must be made available to a Biosecurity Inspector or Authorised Person upon request.

Transportation – Vessel or Vehicle

17. Transporter (vehicle or vessel) must carry a copy of the CAN permit and know and understand their responsibilities when in control of the consignment.
During transportation the transporter must contain all residual and runoff water from the consignment and prevent this from returning to the marine environment of the consignment originating from outside the donor zone [**enter name of donor zone and remove brackets**] donor zone. Residual and wastewater may only be discharged at stock effluent stops, or on land in a manner that prevents it from returning to the marine environment.



Transporters must report any accidental spillage or incident that may compromise the integrity of the consignment to MPI (MPI National Communications Centre (0800 476 224) and the permit holder, as soon as reasonably practicable.

Penalties for Non-compliance

This measure has been imposed to restrict the spread of a pest or unwanted organism, namely *Bonamia ostreae*. Failure to comply with the conditions in this permit is an offence under section 154N(8) of the Act. This carries a penalty under section 157(4) of the Act, in the case of an individual, of imprisonment for a term not exceeding 3 months, a fine not exceeding \$50,000, or both and in the case of a corporation, to a fine not exceeding \$100,000.
